The Curriculum

English

The children are going to continue producing pieces of writing for their end of Year 6 writing assessment evidence portfolio. They will learn how to effectively include dialogue to move the action along and to convey the character through narrative. Their first narrative will be based on the book: Rose Blanche by Christophe Gallaz and Roberto Innocenti and the second piece will be based on our class reader: Fritz & Kurt by Jeremy Dronfield. The children's writing will be based on World War II as in history, they are studying the Battle of Britain.

Reading

In reading, the children will explore their class reader Fritz & Kurt and the book Rose Blanche as well as The Island' by Armin Greder. They will also look at song lyrics and study the song: 'When you love someone' by James TW and celebrate Safer Internet Day with an information text. Please encourage your child to read at home daily. It is important they are reading a variety of genres to expose them to rich vocabulary.



Maths

The children will develop their understanding of fractions, decimals and percentages and learn about area and volume. We will be focusing on arithmetic this half-term so please encourage your child to complete their weekly arithmetic homework paper. Please encourage your child to practise their times tables at home on https://ttrockstars.com/.

In Science, the children will be learning about Electricity.

In **History**, the children will learn about the Battle of Britain. They will visit Bletchley Park to learn about the importance of it during World War II.

In R.E the children will be learning all about Judaism.

In Computing, the children will be learning about online safety and spreadsheets.

In Art, the children will be developing their sewing skills and will produce an end piece of work linked to the Blitz.

In Music, the children will be completing a composing unit on Clef Notation.

In P.E, the children will be learning the skills of hockey and gymnastics.

In **PSHE**, children will be exploring the unit of 'Dreams & Goals' where they will be looking at setting future goals and aspirations.

Things to remember:

Homework & Reading records are due on **Mondays**.

Children will now receive paper copies of homework to help them prepare for SATs. They will receive an arithmetic paper and either a reading/SPAG every week. It is really important that the children complete this so that we can help them aim to achieve their very best in their exams. They will also get a curriculum homework menu to choose creative tasks!
