Year 4 Homework

The Curriculum

English

In English, the children will be exploring the features of Newspaper Reports, creating their own headlines using alliteration, looking at eyewitness statements and revisiting fronted adverbials. The children will then go on to plan and write their own newspaper report. We will then share some Poetry with the children and explore similes and metaphors before they write their own.

Maths

In maths the children will be finding out about Fractions. They will explore the whole, partition, compare and convert mixed numbers moving onto understanding equivalent fractions then adding and subtracting fractions. Finally, we will link fractions to decimals.

We encourage children to practise their times tables at home on TTRS.

Other Curriculum Subjects.

In Science the children will be taking part in Science Week, the theme this year is Time. The children will watch a live lesson, learn about different careers involving science skills and take part in science lessons across the week.

In **History** the children will be learning about the Anglo-Saxons.

In ${\bf R}.{\bf E}$ the children will exploring if forgiveness always possible for Christians.

In Computing the children will use Logo.

In DT the children will continue to make their bendy bag then they will evaluate it.

In **Art** the children will explore different painting techniques and tints and proportions and use these in a still life picture.

In **music** the children will continue to learn how to play several different pieces on the keyboard.

In P.E 4PH will be going swimming and the remainder of the year group will take part in gymnastics.

Things to remember.
