The Curriculum

English

We are changing our approach to English in the run up to the writing assessments and therefore will be setting the children until the assessments have been submitted. Therefore, your child may be taught by a different member of the Year 6 team for English lessons. We will be basing our writing on a clip about the Three Little Pigs! The children will be writing witness reports, character descriptions and a newspaper report!

Reading

Our class book this half-term is 'Skellig' by David Almond. This will form part of our whole class reading sessions. They will be looking at newspaper reports as well as revising the key VIPERs skills in preparation for their tests.

The children have worked so diligently this year and we have almost covered the Year 6 Maths Curriculum. They will learn about position and direction and how to reflect and translate shapes on a four-quadrant grid. The children will then spend time this half-term revising key concepts in preparation for their exams and then carry out problem-solving projects when SATs are over.

- In Science, the children will be learning about the respiratory and circulatory system.
- In Geography, the children will be learning about British National Parks.
- In R.E the children will be exploring: How is the Qur'an vital to Muslims today?
- In Computing, the children will develop their Binary skills.
- In DT, the children will be making Caribbean Fruit cocktails.
- In Music, the children will be learning to play the guitar.
- In P.E, the children will be learning how to play tennis as well as athletics.
- In PSHE, children will be exploring the unit of 'Relationships'.
