Curriculum Newsletter

Welcome back!

We hope everyone had an enjoyable break and managed to enjoy the small sprinkling of sunshine that we had!

We have lots of exciting learning opportunities for the children this half term-including our trip to Bradwell Abbey on 20th June. Please ensure that if you haven't made payment for the trip yet, that you do so as soon as possible. Without enough contributions, we may be forced to cancel.

As the weather is (hopefully) getting much warmer, please ensure your child comes to school wearing sun cream & brings a hat with them. Please can I also take this opportunity to remind you that even if the warmer weather, children are still expected to wear the correct school uniform. We are seeing an increase in the number of children wearing incorrect uniform- particularly on PE days. Children also need to be wearing plain black school shoes or trainers, except on PE days. We do not allow children to wear sandals in the summer months. We look forward to working with you to support your child's learning over the term.

The Curriculum

English

This half term, we are starting our writing with a unit on recounts. This will culminate in the children writing their own recount of our upcoming trip to Bradwell Abbey. After this, we will be looking at narrative writing, with a focus on writing vivid descriptions.

Maths

In maths the children will be completing their work on shape, before moving on to interpreting bar charts, line graphs and pictograms (including drawing their own). After this we will move on to position and direction where we will draw 2D shapes on a grid, describe translations and plot co-ordinates. We will then revisit number lines and the four operations.

Other Curriculum Subjects

Science: The children will be learning about States of Matter. As part of this the children will learn about solids, liquids and gases and how different materials change state and the temperature it happens.

History: This half term's topic within History is the Vicious Vikings. Within this topic, we will be continuing their historical research and thinking. They will be developing their source work and using these sources to gain details of the past.

R.E: This term we are studying Sikhism and will be looking at the following enquiry question: Does joining the Khalsa make someone a better Sikh?

Computing: The children will be exploring how they can manipulate fonts and layouts to appeal to different audiences and for different text types.

Art: In art we will be looking at sculpture and 3D modelling using cardboard.

Music: The children will be learning to play and perform a variety of songs linked to environments. They will also be learning how to sing with emotion.

P.E: This half term we will be covering cricket and athletics, as well as preparing for our upcoming Sports Day at the end of June (weather permitting!)

PSHE: This half term we will be looking at how and why our bodies change as we get older and who we can speak to if we have any worries or concerns about this.

Things to Remember! Year 4 Multiplication Check

PE
