Dear Parents and Carers,

Our move across to Arbor has started this week. Thank you to everybody that has followed our communication and connected to the Parent Portal. **After half term, we anticipate this being our only** communication channel, so please connect your account if you have not already. From now on, **absences should be reported, on a daily basis, through Arbor**. To do this, access the Attendance section, input the absence details, and submit the request. School staff will then approve or reject the absence. Once approved, it will be visible in the Attendance tab. Absence requests cannot be edited, only deleted and recreated if changes are needed, and approved absences cannot be deleted. If you need any support with this, please speak to staff in either of our school offices.

This week we have marked **National Safer Internet Day** by talking to children about staying safe online. It is disappointing that so many children freely access apps and websites that are not age appropriate.
