
The Curriculum

English

The children will learn how to write a fantasy narrative battle scene using the battles from the Hobbit and Harry Potter and the Deathly Hallows for inspiration. Later in the term, we will be writing explanation texts about 'How to survive a natural disaster'. This will link back to our Geography study from the Autumn term. Please encourage your child to practise their weekly spellings as well as the Year 3/4 and Year 5/6 statutory spellings.

Reading

In Reading, the children will explore the text Fairtrade First by Sarah Ridley and will study poetry from the poet Ted Hughes. We will also be celebrating World Book Day and looking at picture books. We will be using the text 'The Viewer' by Shaun Tan, which will inspire Art work. Our Class Book this half-term is: Clockwork by Philip Pullman.





<u>Maths</u>

The children will begin to learn about statistics (line graphs, pie charts and finding the mean) and shape (angles, circles and drawing shapes). Please encourage your child to practise their times tables at home on https://ttrockstars.com/.

In **Science**, the children will be celebrating Science Week and this year's theme is: Adapt and Change! We are excited to get involved in this year's Science Week.

In Geography, the children will learn about the world of Fairtrade!

In Computing, the children will be learning about spreadsheets and text adventures.

In DT, the children will be learning about Electrical systems with Computer control.

In Music, the children will be completing a unit on Samba.

In P.E, the children will be continuing gymnastics and also learning how to play tag rugby.
